Campaign: From Diocese to Divinity

Format: 7-week leadership series for small groups, ministry teams, or church cohorts

Audience: Church leaders, educators, civic influencers, and institutional reformers

Goal: Equip groups to audit, reform, and rededicate institutions for the glory of Christ

Weekly Structure Overview

- Group Reflection Questions
- Strategic Activation Challenge
- Closing Prayer & Commission

Week-by-Week Guide

Week 1: Audit Institutional Influence – Unmasking the Deceived

Scripture: Ezekiel 8, Revelation 2–3

Discussion Questions:

- What compromises or secular influences exist in your institution?
- How do hidden practices affect public witness?
- What does a spiritual audit look like in your context?

Activation: Conduct a spiritual and operational audit of your institution. Identify areas needing reform.

Week 2: Consecrate the Leadership – Sanctifying the Stewards

Scripture: Exodus 28, Romans 12:1–2

Discussion Questions:

- What does consecration mean for institutional leaders?
- How can we restore spiritual integrity in leadership?
- What barriers prevent leaders from full surrender?

Activation: Host a leadership consecration ceremony. Pray over key leaders and invite public rededication.

Week 3: Reform Policy and Culture – Rewriting the Code

Scripture: Nehemiah 5, Colossians 3:12–17

Discussion Questions:

- What policies or cultural norms need to be rewritten?
- How do we balance grace and truth in institutional reform?
- What does a Christ-centered culture look like?

Activation: Draft or revise one institutional policy to reflect biblical values. Present it to leadership.

Week 4: Build Kingdom Infrastructure – Constructing for the Kingdom

Scripture: Isaiah 58:12, Matthew 16:18

Discussion Questions:

- What infrastructure is needed to sustain Christ-centered influence?
- How can we build systems that reflect eternal values?
- What partnerships or resources are required?

Activation: Begin planning a new initiative—school, media platform, clinic, or ministry hub.

Week 5: Commission Apostolic Governance – Governing with Grace

Scripture: Exodus 18:21–26, Ephesians 4:11–13

Discussion Questions:

- What does apostolic governance mean in today's institutions?
- How can we train leaders in both spiritual and civic authority?
- What governance models reflect Kingdom stewardship?

Activation: Identify and commission emerging leaders. Create a leadership development pathway.

Week 6: Declare Institutional Redemption – Publicly Reclaiming Territory

Scripture: Psalm 24:1, Revelation 11:15

Discussion Questions:

- What does it mean to publicly rededicate an institution to Christ?
- How can we involve the community in this declaration?
- What spiritual impact does public repentance have?

Activation: Host a rededication event—invite leaders, intercessors, and the public to witness the shift.

Week 7: Sustain with Prayer and Strategy – Guarding the Gates

Scripture: Daniel 6:10, Habakkuk 2:2–3

Discussion Questions:

- How do we sustain spiritual momentum in institutions?
- What role does intercession play in long-term transformation?
- How can we measure and adapt our strategy?

Activation: Form an intercessory team and strategic planning group. Create a 12-month roadmap for growth.
